



YES, HE'S REALLY CUTE, BUT...

1. Please don't allow your puppy to be rude and jump on other dogs. It is unrealistic to expect every other dog to like your dog. Protect your puppy by helping him to learn appropriate behavior. If he becomes over-excited around another dog, you may want to move him to a different location in the area.
2. Respect the fact that other dogs may have a need and the right to their personal space. Please don't allow your puppy to rush up and say "Hi" to other dogs.
3. ALWAYS ASK FIRST if it's OK for your puppy to greet or play with another dog.
4. For his own protection, please pay attention to what your puppy is doing and where he is at all times. Keep your puppy close to your side.
5. Think about how you will handle problematic situations such as carrying rather than walking a small pup through a congested area, or bringing a "puppy pacifier" to class to keep your pup busy and out of another dog's personal space.
